

All students take five core subjects (ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Spanish) and a wide range of special topics courses. Every student attends a universal study hall four days a week to receive additional support from teachers, as well as small group tutoring.

In addition to their core subjects, 6th grade students take two foundational courses: Learning to Learn and Introduction to Emotional Intelligence. These courses support their academic, social, and emotional growth as they transition into middle school and high school.

Our teaching methods are diverse and adaptive, designed to meet the unique academic and developmental needs of every student. We work to empower a community of teachers and learners to center both joy and purpose in the learning process. DLSA's academic program invites students to learn in novel ways and connect their learning to the world around them.



- High school entrance exam preparation classes






FAMILY LIFE

99% of DLSA students receive financial aid. While every family pays a portion of tuition, we partner with every accepted family to ensure they can afford to attend DLSA.

Nearly 90% of our operating budget is funded by sources other than tuition.


